Wash hands with soap and water. Dry thoroughly.




2 Gently clean the vaginal area with a non-alcoholic based antiseptic wipe utilizing a circular motion.





3 Open the package by peeling blue layer away from white. Remove the belt from the catheter case and hold the sleeve near the catheter tip using your thumb and index finger. Avoid touching the catheter.





A Rub the sleeve to lubricate catheter. Pull the sleeve back to expose the catheter until about 1" is revealed, or both eyelets are visible.

Indication

CompactCath® LITE Lubricated Intermittent Urinary Catheter is indicated for use in male, female, and pediatric patients (adolescents and transitional adolescents) with chronic urine retention and patients with post void residual volume (PVR) due to neurogenic and non-neurogenic voiding dysfunction. The catheter is inserted into the urethra to reach the bladder allowing urine to drain.

Warnings and Cautions

Federal law restricts this device to be sold by or on the order of a physician. The catheter is for single use only, and must then be discarded. CompactCath Inc. accepts no liability for injury or loss resulting from use of this product in any manner if the catheter is not used entirely in accordance with the company's recommendations.

Self-catheterization is a safe and common procedure. However, it is important that prior to using CompactCath® LITE Lubricated Intermittent Urinary Catheter you would consult a medical professional for guidance and that you follow these instructions carefully. Self-catheterizing using this product should only be done on the order of a physician/nurse.

If you experience that the catheter does not drain your bladder the way you are used to, please contact a physician/ nurse. In case of Urinary Tract Infection with symptoms such as fever, discomfort when emptying the bladder. a frequent urge to urinate or blood in the urine, contact your physician/nurse.

If the pouch of the catheter is not sealed, or if the catheter is otherwise damaged, do not use the catheter. Store product at room temperature. However, exposure to extreme temperatures (below 0°C or above 60°C) for up to 24 hours will not damage the catheter.

Wash hands with soap and water. Dry thoroughly.




Gently clean the tip of the penis with a non-alcoholic based antiseptic wipe utilizing a circular motion.



3 Open the package by peeling blue layer away from white. Remove the belt from the catheter case and hold the sleeve near the catheter tip using your thumb and index finger. Avoid touching the catheter.



Rub the sleeve to lubricate catheter. Pull the sleeve back to expose the catheter until about 1" is revealed, or both evelets are visible.



5 Slowly guide catheter tip into urethra while holding the sleeve with your thumb and index finger. If using a Coudé tip, make sure the curved part is pointing up. Do not allow the sleeve to enter the urethra.



Once the catheter has reached the bladder

and you are ready to void, push the catheter

funnel out and aim it towards the toilet or a

collection device.

6 While gripping the sleeve, continue advancing the catheter into the urethra.



Repeat step 6 until the catheter has reached the bladder.



10 Once urine stops flowing and your bladder is empty, lock the funnel back into place. This will prevent residual urine from dripping.



Discard the catheter.
